IBA THÜRINGEN: Experimental, broad-minded and innovative building in Stadtland Thuringia.

Imagine ... an empty fire extinguisher factory in Apolda reactivated as a location for diverse forms of culture and manufacturing, ... a grass-roots revival of the historical 'Sommerfrische' holiday residences of the Schwarzatal, ... a self-build initiative by a young architectural cooperative in Bedheim as a model for innovative building in rural locations.

WHO WE ARE IBA FOR THURINGIA



From 2012 until 2023, the International Building Exhibition is developing projects in and for Thuringia that are innovative, experimental, emulable and replicable!

What we do — our project processes are tailored to the small-scale settlement pattern of the Free State of Thuringia. We foster and develop resource-friendly projects that strengthen local communities in the rural-urban StadtLand of Thuringia, and identify new approaches to connecting and cultivating bonds between the town and country. How we work — we motivate project partners to implement innovative StadtLand projects, support cooperative processes and promote excellent design. We work in partnership across boundaries and disciplines, locally and internationally, facilitating through salons, conferences and exhibitions.

What characterises IBA projects -

currently we support 28 StadtLand initiatives, of which 16 are IBA candidates and 12 are IBA projects. IBA projects are innovative in character, excellent in design, and feasible and sustainable in their conception. The first IBA project was completed in June 2017: the art installation 'organ' by Carsten Nicolai in the Chapel of St. Anna in Krobitz. StadtLand projects and their development and implementation have three key areas of focus:

• REUSE: Vacant Properties

We reactivate vacant buildings throughout the state, adapting and combining new models of usage with other building standards.

• **DEVELOP: Collective Responsibility** We support bold initiatives and help cultivate new forms of collaboration between public administration, the private sector and civil society.

• **BUILD: Modern Province** We develop new projects in urban and rural contexts, realise new experimental buildings and promote building culture as a hallmark of Thuringia.

In 2017, more than 20,000 people visited the exhibition '500 Churches, 500 Ideas' organised by the IBA and Wanted: new visions and unconventional ideas! EKM Evangelical Church at the Kaufmannskirche in Erfurt to learn about new perspectives for the many vacant protestant churches in Central Germany




